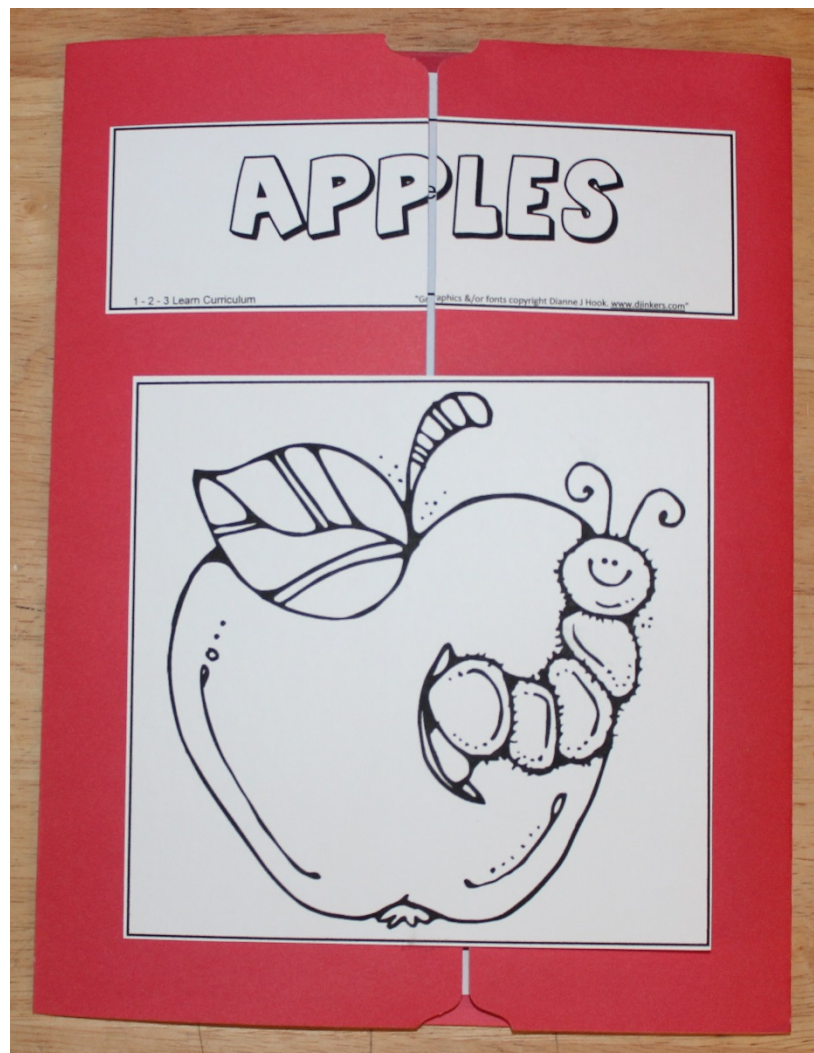

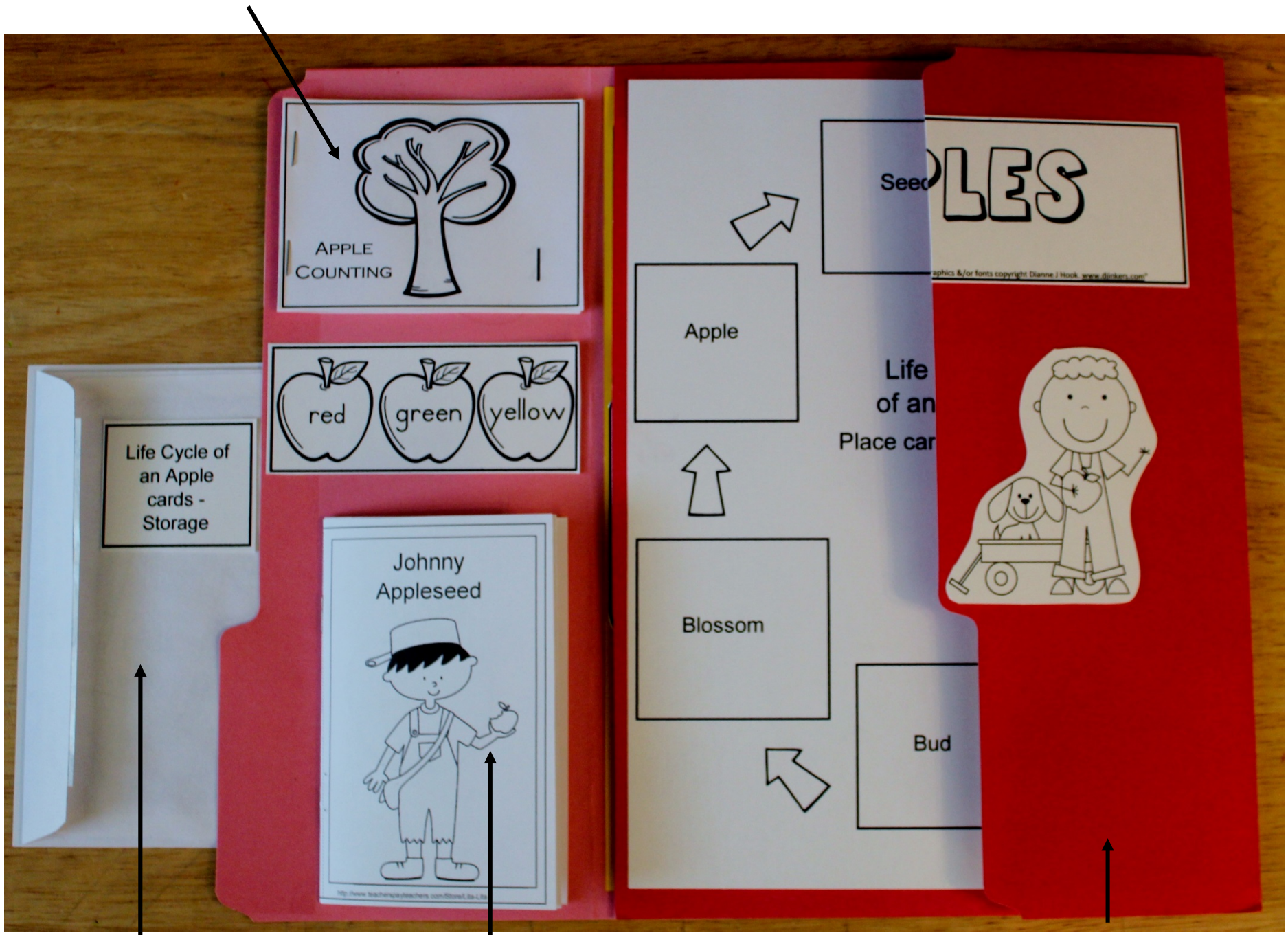
Apple Lap book

- Print up the cover sheet onto white card stock.
- Have children color and cut out.
- Cut the apples label in half, and attach to both sides of the lap book, so that when the lap book is closed, the label connects.
- Add picture to the front of the lap book. (You will apply glue or double sided tape to only the left side of the orange card stock so the lap book opens.)

Storage for Life Cycle of an Apple Book

- Make a pocket for book by using a piece of colored cardstock. (Sample shows a yellow pocket).
- Measure the width you want and cut it down.
- Using double sided tape on both sides and bottom of colored card stock, attach to the bottom.
- Tape or glue the apple pictures and Life Cycle of an Apple banner picture to the back of the lapbook.

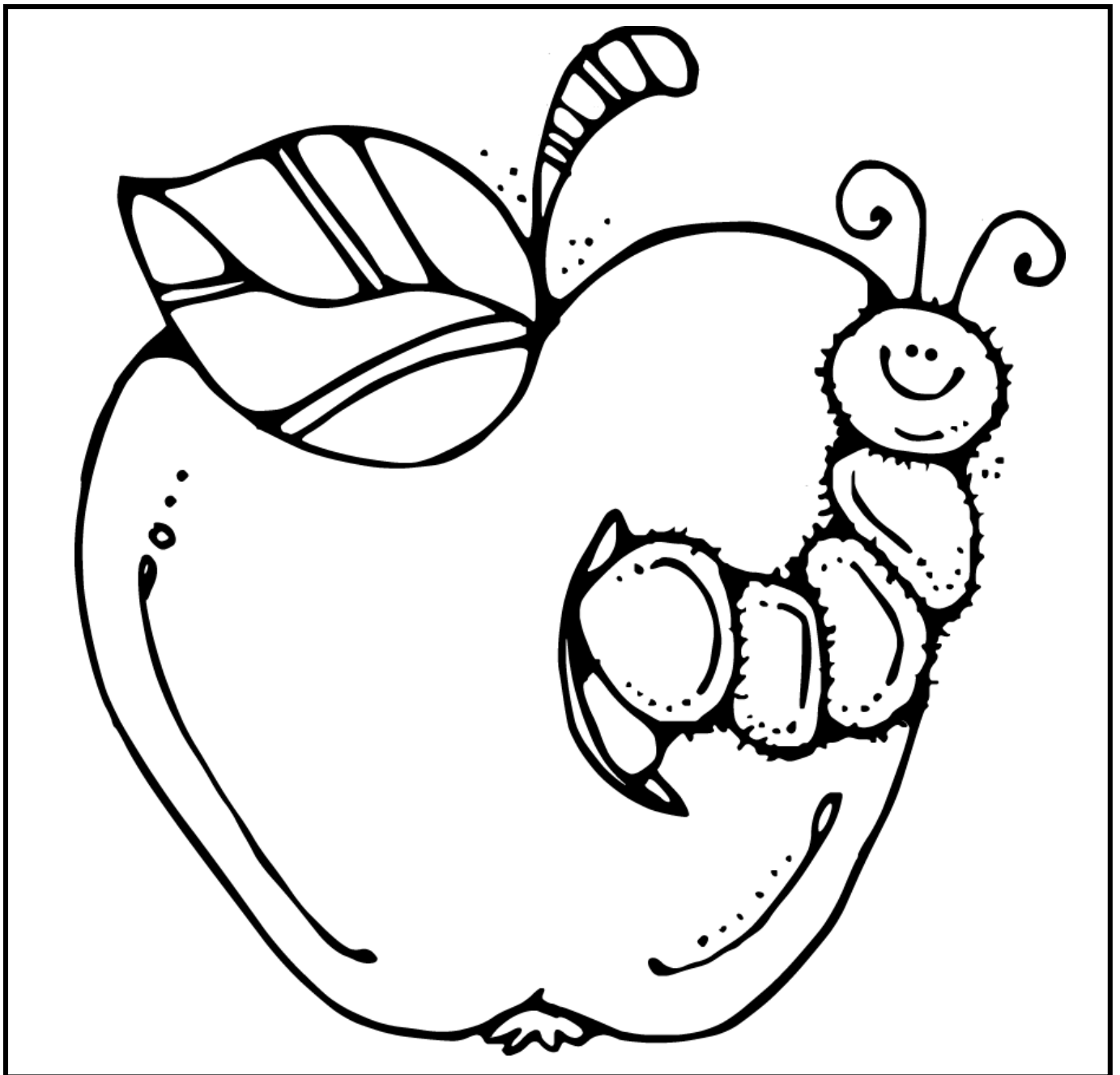

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Apple Tree Counting Book

- Print up on white copy paper/
- Trim.
- Put book in order and staple on the left side.
- Using double sided tape or glue attach to the upper – left hand side of the apple lapbook.

(See pictures).

Have children color apples on each page. They can place apples on tree or falling off the tree. 😊

1 apple for the number 1.

2 apples for the number 2 and so on.

Another alternative: Use small apple stickers and have children place on the pages after they colored their trees.

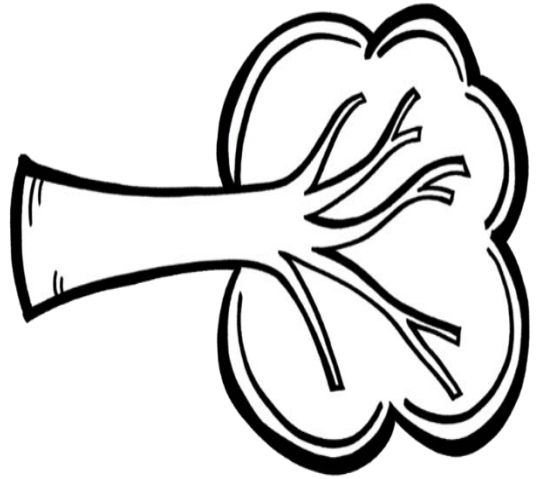
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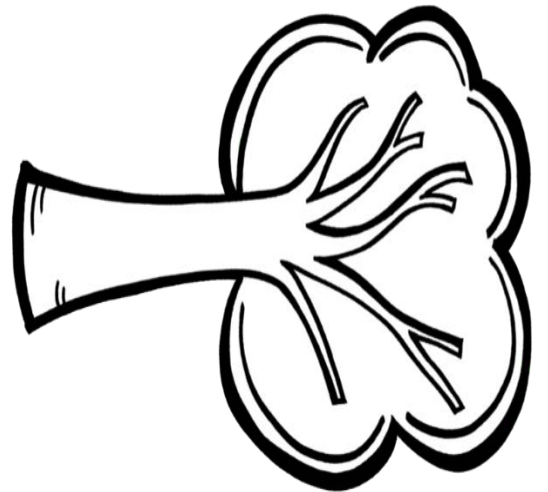

Staple together,

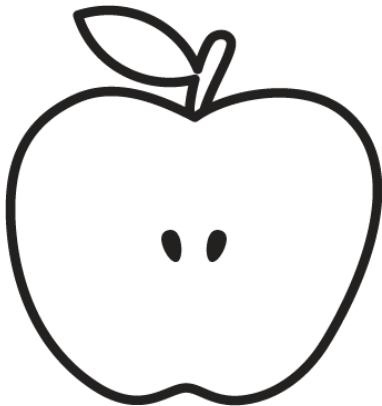
Using double sided tape on the back page and place in your lapbook – left hand side.

What Can I Make with an Apple Flip book

- Print up the following sheet onto regular copy paper or card stock.

- Trim.
- Attach to a flipbook and attach to the inside of the lapbook. Right hand side.

(File is made with either a boy or girl at the end of the flipbook).

Dimensions for the flipbook:

3 sheets of card stock 9 1/2 inch by 3 1/2 inch.

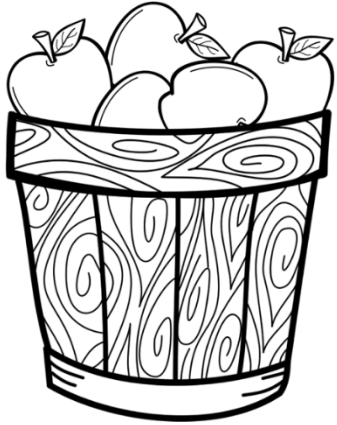
(Cut out 2 strips with one color cardstock and 1 strip using another color of cardstock.

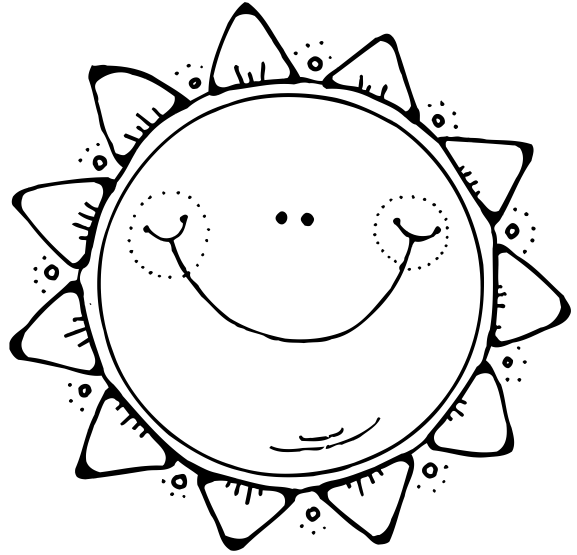
Apple Vocabulary Words (Flashcards)

Additional idea: Have children practice writing words on paper or dry eraser boards.



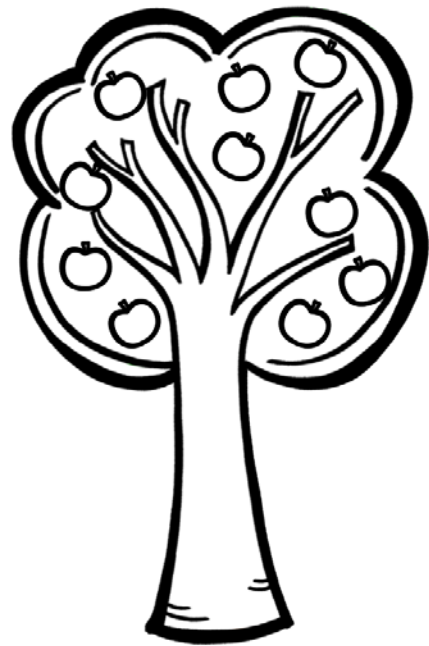

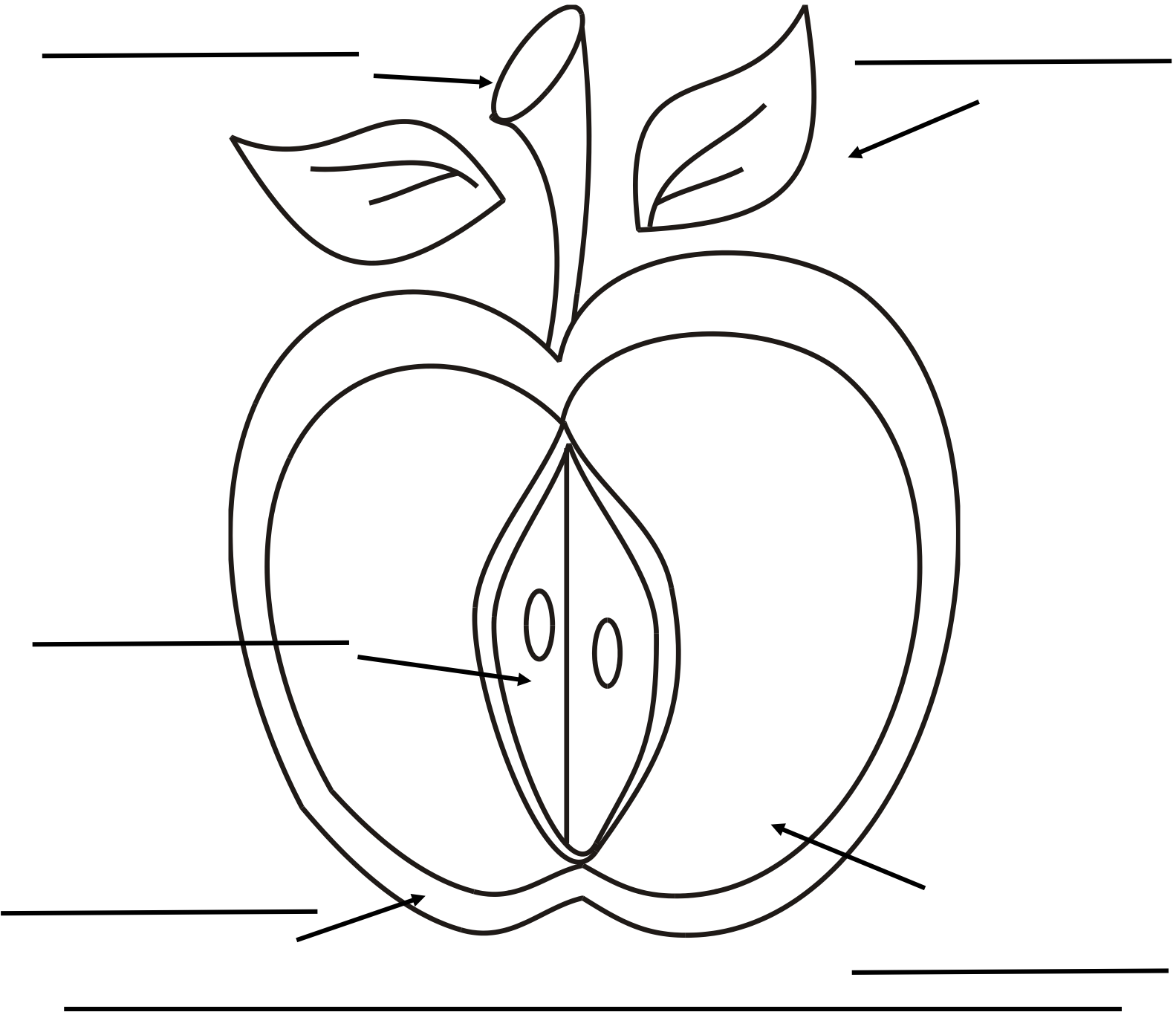
Pocket for Flash Cards

Cut out – fold on the dotted lines and tape or glue together to form a pocket. Use to store shape flash cards.

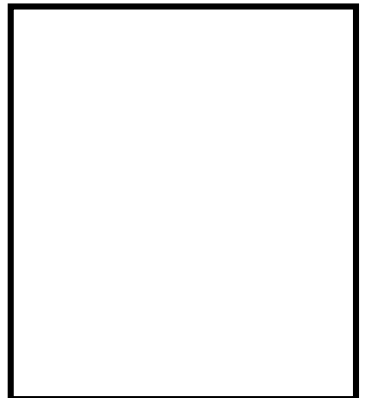
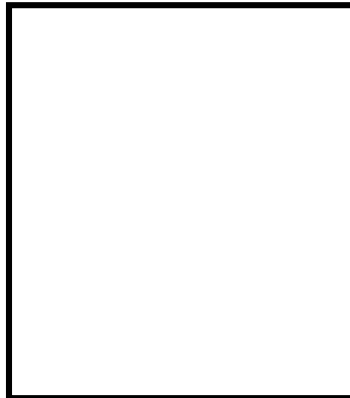
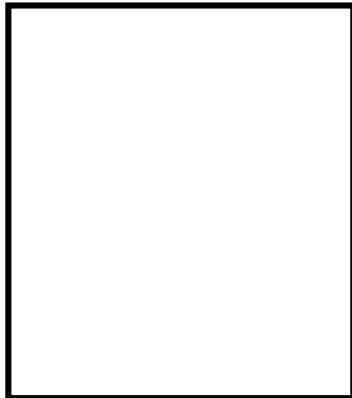
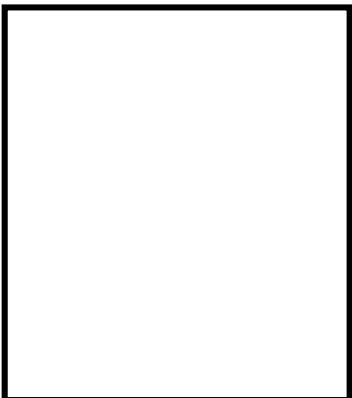

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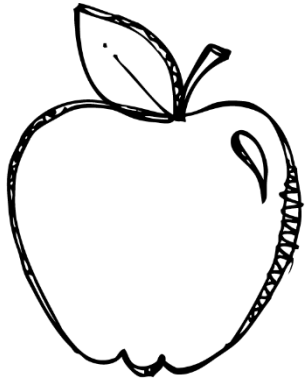
Apple Eating Sequencing Cards – 1 set per child. Color – cut out. Glue in order of eating. (Apple, 1 bite, 2 bites, apple core).



Apple Tasting and Apple Colors Mini Books

- Print up sheets on white card stock. (1 book per child).
- Cut out – trim.
- Color.
- Fold each strip like an accordion.
- Using doubled sided tape or glue attach each book to the inside of the lapbook. (Check pictures to see location of each book).

Print up on white card stock – Girl Template

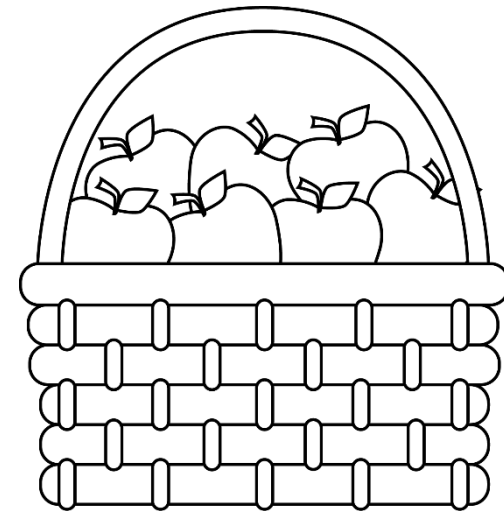
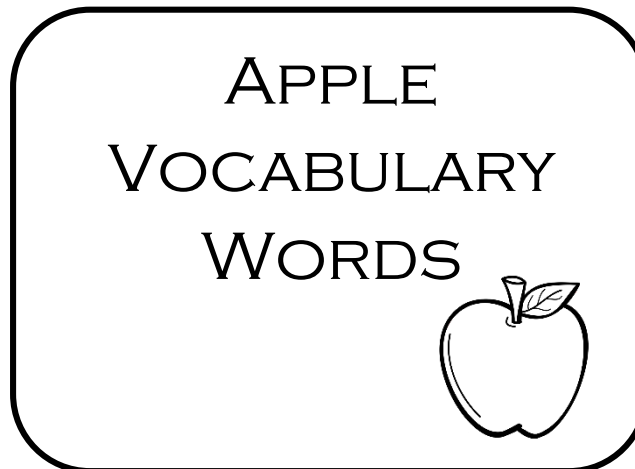
Glue or tape to the back of the lapbook. (On the pocket you make). Make a pocket out of yellow card stock to store apple book.



Glue to tape between apple counting book and Johnny apple seed book.

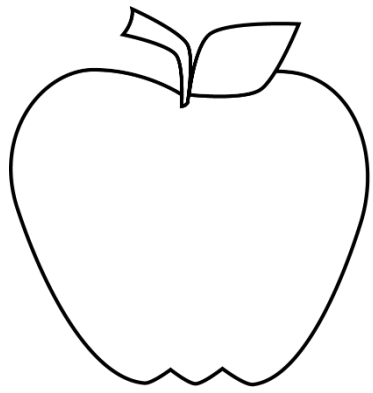

Life Cycle of an Apple Book

Book comes in 2 formats (With printed word to practice writing and no words for older children)

Print first 2 sheets back to back. Fold in $\frac{1}{2}$.

Print up last 2 pages back to back. Fold in $\frac{1}{2}$ and place inside the cover.

Staple if desired. (You will need a longer stapler in order to do this. Can be purchased at Office Max or other office supply store).

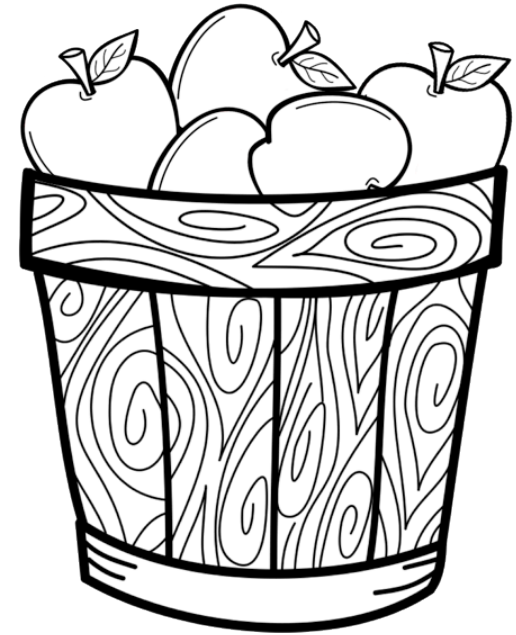
