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Fun Groundhog Day Facts

- February 2 brings the most-watched weather forecast of the year – and the only one led by a rodent!
- Groundhogs are also known as whistle pigs. When frightened, a groundhog will give off a loud sharp whistle, then softer ones as it runs for the cover of its burrow. Hence the name: whistlepig. Groundhogs are also known as marmots and woodchucks.
- German tradition holds that if the sun comes out on Candlemas, the precursor to Groundhog Day, the hedgehog (or badger) will see its shadow and six more weeks of winter will follow. When German settlers came to Pennsylvania they continued this tradition, using groundhogs instead of hedgehogs to predict the weather.
- The first official Groundhog Day was celebrated on February 2, 1886 in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania.
- Groundhogs Are Big Snoozers. Groundhogs take winter hibernation seriously.
- Groundhogs, which are the largest members of the squirrel family, are naturally aggressive and rambunctious creatures.





Fun Groundhog Day Facts



- Punxsutawney Phil is the original star of Groundhog Day.
 He first predicted the weather 126 years ago and has had about 39 percent accuracy ever since.
- The name Punxsutawney Phil may be a bit of a mouthful, but that's not even his full name. The weather-predicting groundhog's official name is: "Punxsutawney Phil, Seer of Seers, Sage of Sages, Prognosticator of Prognosticators and Weather Prophet Extraordinaire."
- Groundhogs are great swimmers and tree climbers.




Will Punxsutawney Phil, the groundhog see his shadow February 2? color sheet.

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









