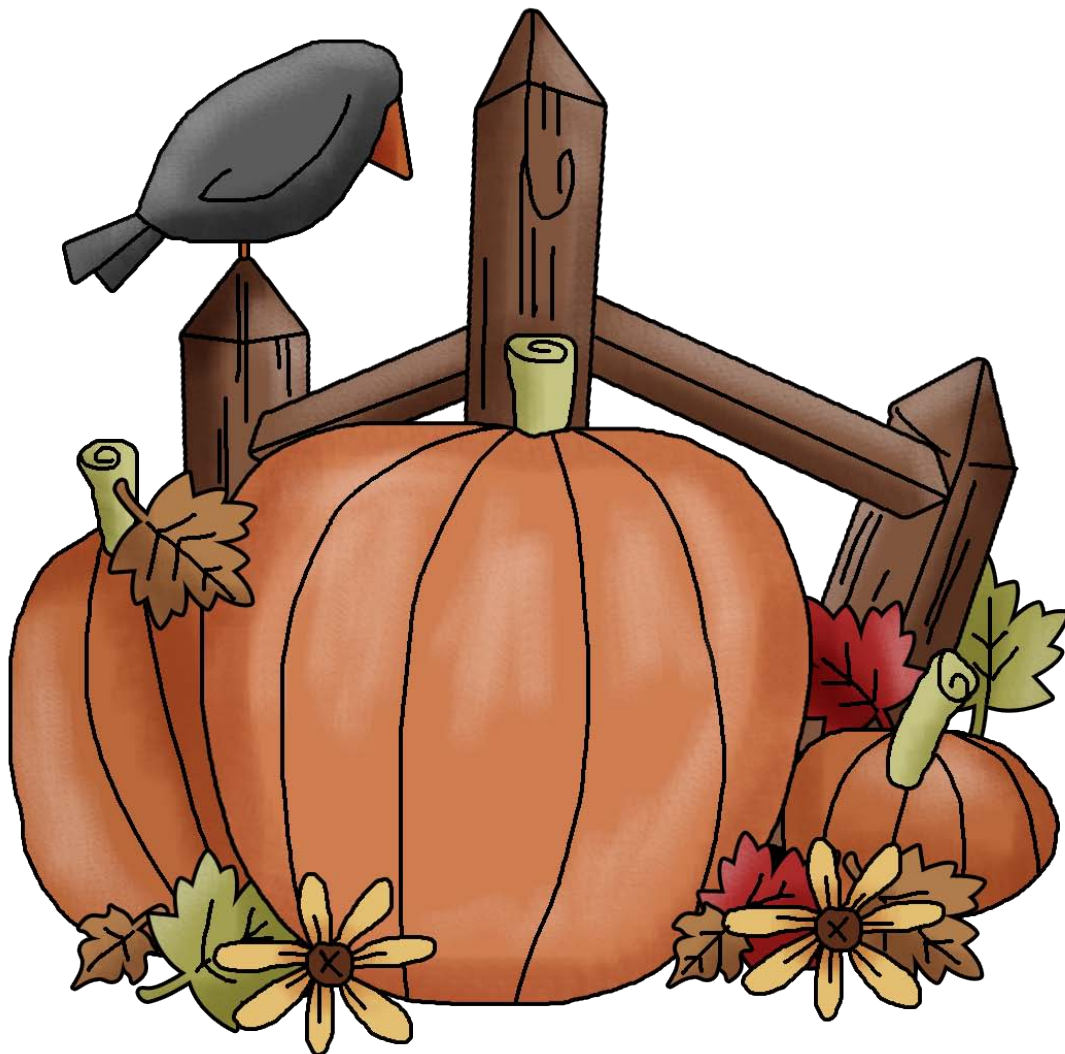

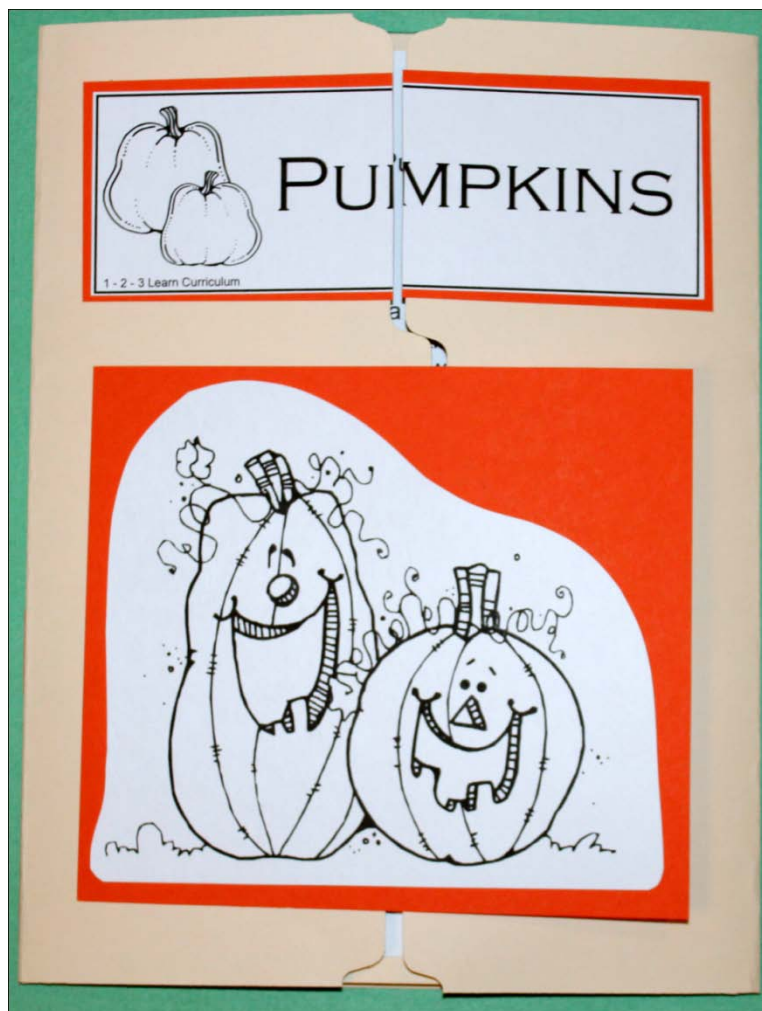

Pumpkins Lap book

- Print up the cover sheet onto white card stock.
- Have children color and cut out.
- Add pumpkins label and picture to a piece of orange card stock and trim the orange card stock. (See picture below).
- Cut the pumpkins label in half, and attach to both sides of the lap book, so that when the lap book is closed, the label connects.
- Add picture to the front of the lap book. (You will apply glue or double sided tape to only the left side of the orange card stock so the lap book opens.)

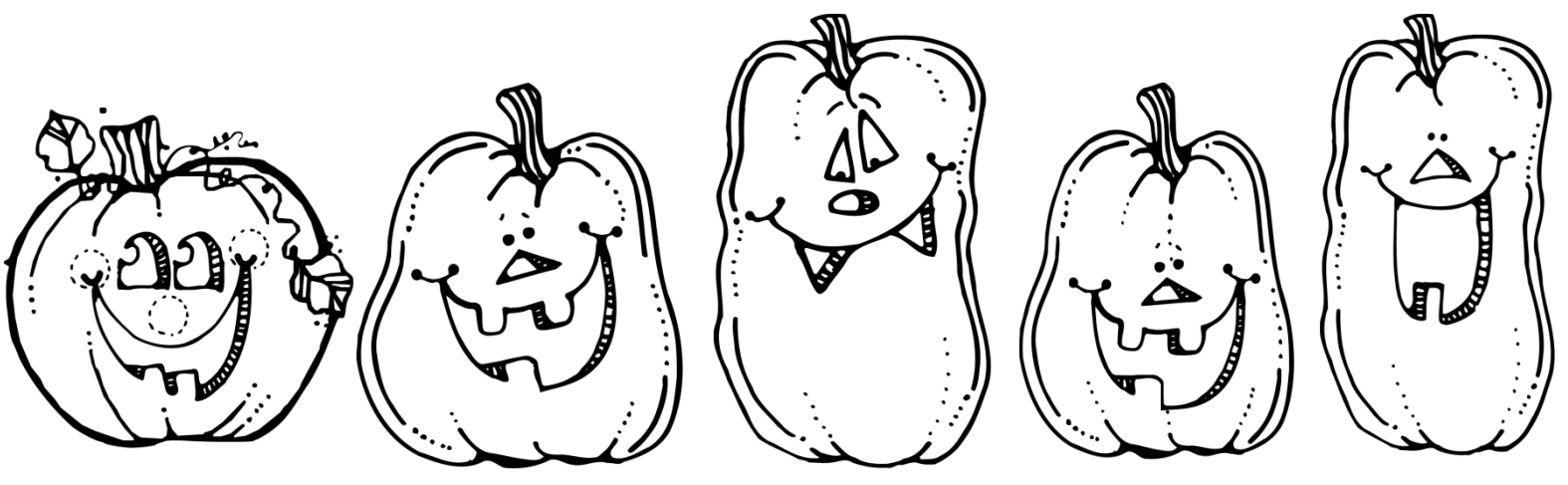
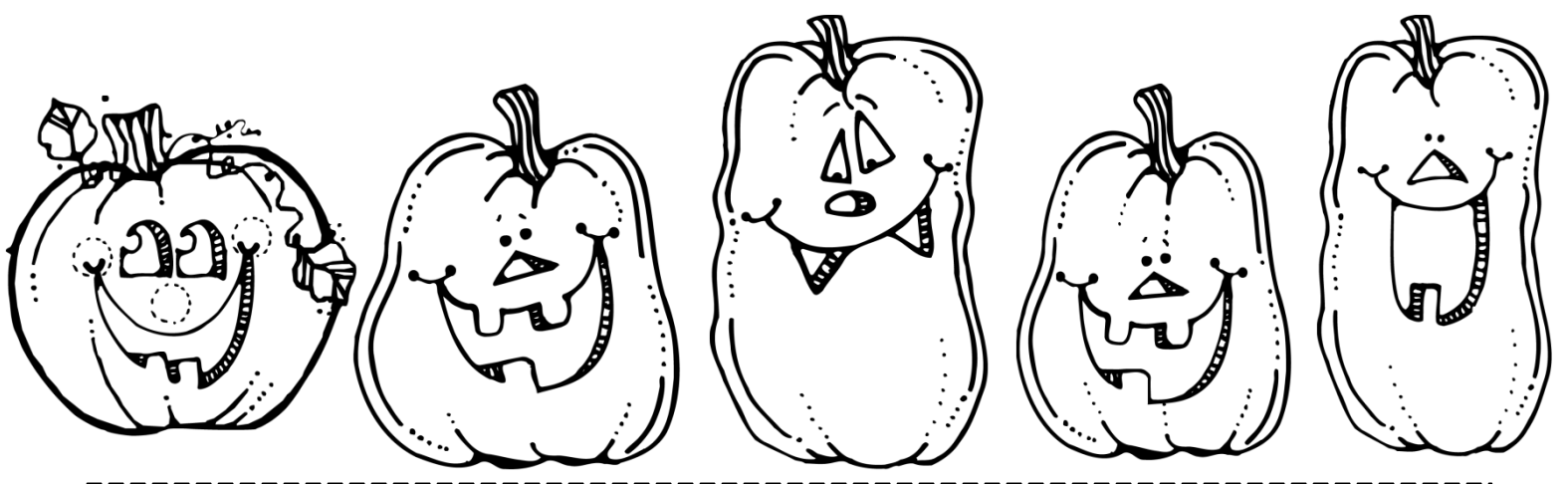
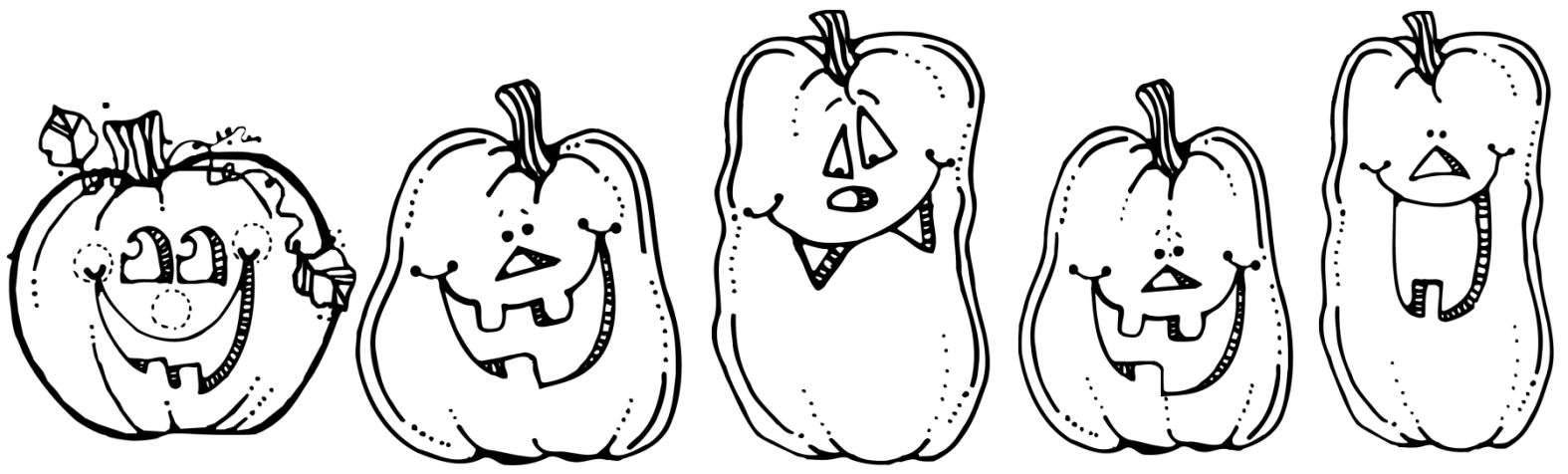
- Print up the following 2 sheets onto white card stock.
- Give each child the sheet with the Five Little Pumpkins poem. Have them color.
- Each child will get a strip of pumpkins. (There are enough for 4 children per sheet).
- Have them color and cut out.
- Add the sheet to the lap book. (See pictures at the beginning of this file to see where to place the sheet).
- Once the sheet is added, cut small pieces of velcro. (Sample shows circles used, cut in quarters).
- Rough side to the back of the pumpkin and place the soft to the rough side of the velcro.
- Place the pumpkin on the fence, sticky side down. This will help in placement of the pumpkins when the children go to play with the Five Little Pumpkins sheet.

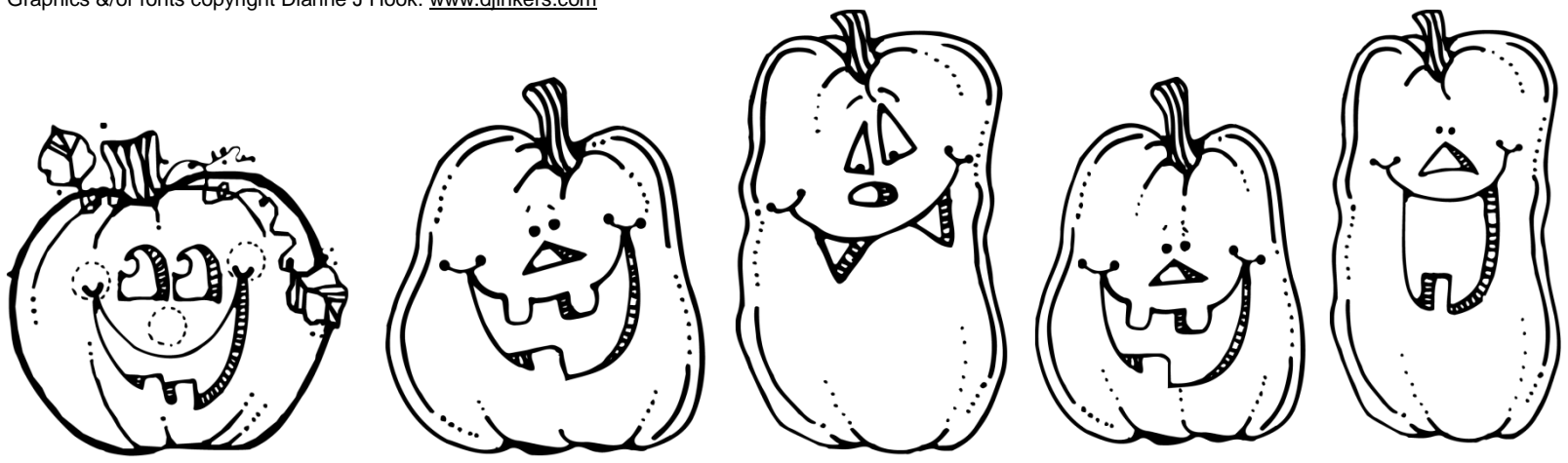

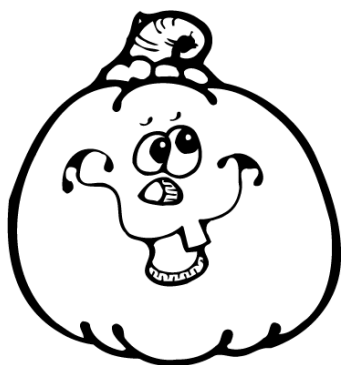
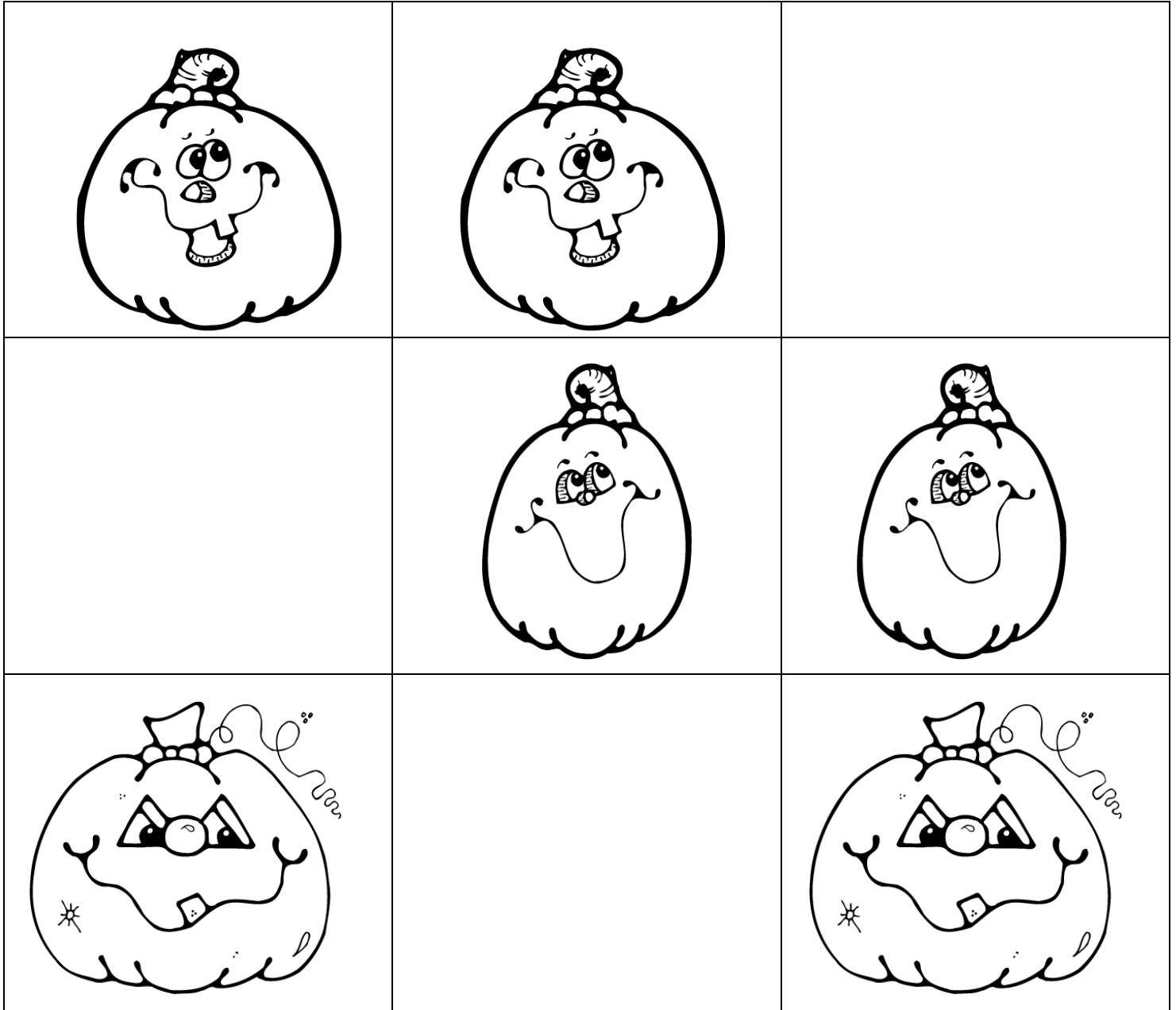

- place velcro on the back of each pumpkin and inside the square where it goes, and children can re-match over and over again.

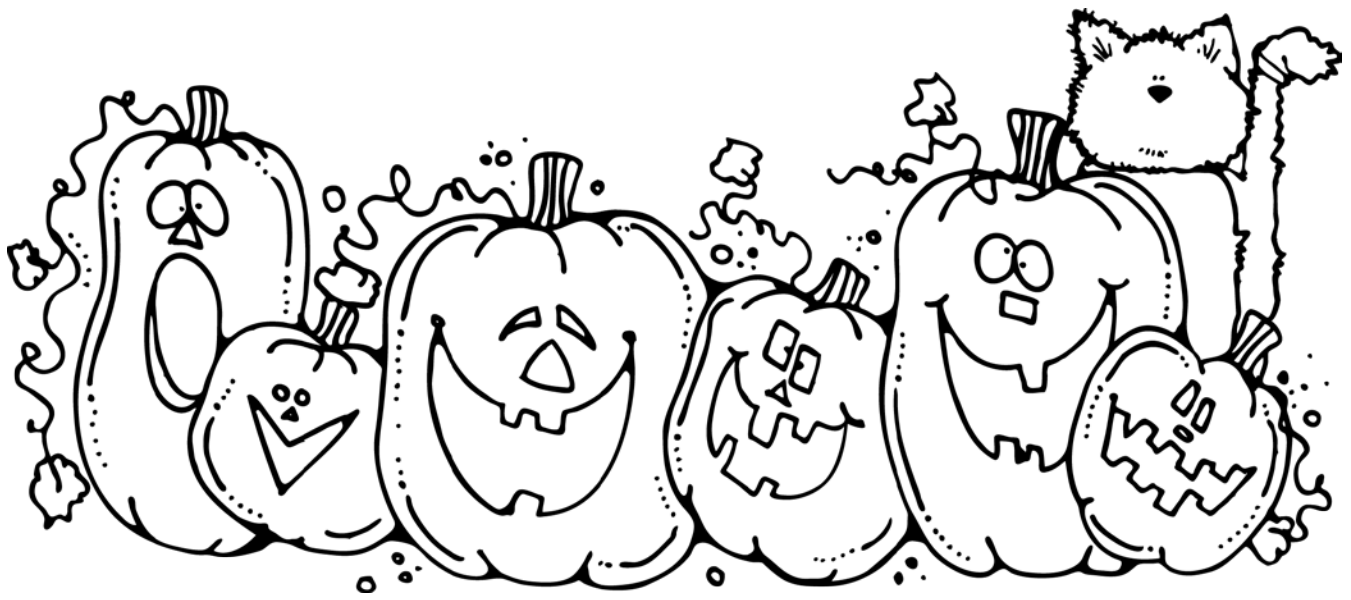

Directions:

- Ahead of time - made a pocket to store the puppets and attach to the inside of the lap book. To do this, measure a piece of orange card stock and trim. Put double sided tape on the sides and bottom of the card stock and attach to the lap book. Creating a pocket to store the puppets. Print up both poem and puppets onto white card stock.
- Have children color and cut out.
- Attach poem to the pocket you made to the inside of the lap book.
- Tape a craft stick to each puppet. Store the puppets inside the pocket.

Flip Book Pumpkins

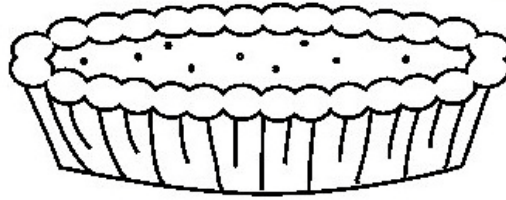
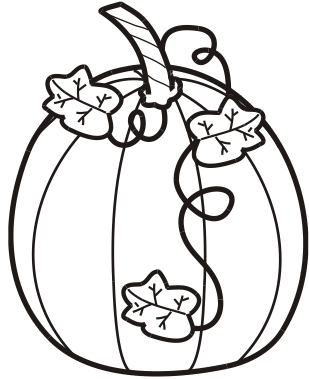
- Print up the following sheet onto regular paper.

Trim the words small, medium and large and 3 pumpkins.

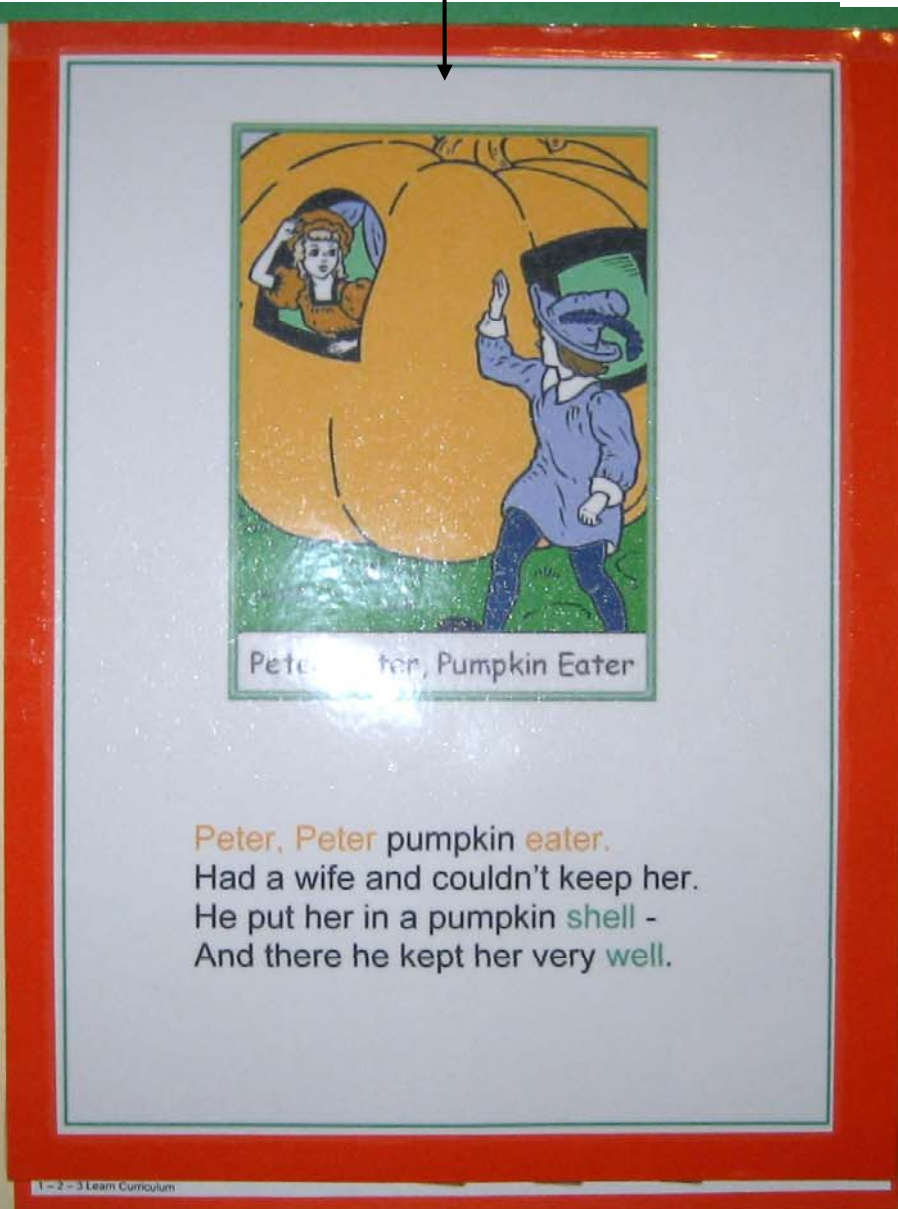
Glue or tape the words onto the right side of the lapbook.

Using velcro, attach to the right side and let the children velcro their pumpkins to the lapbook.

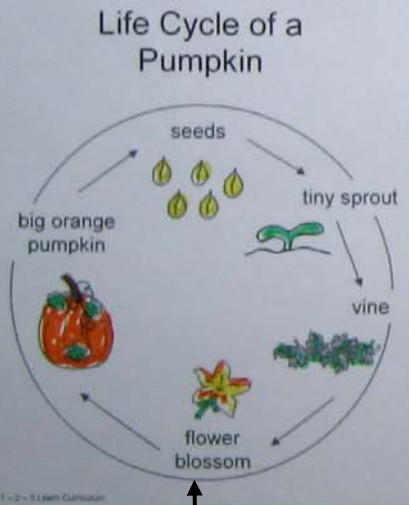

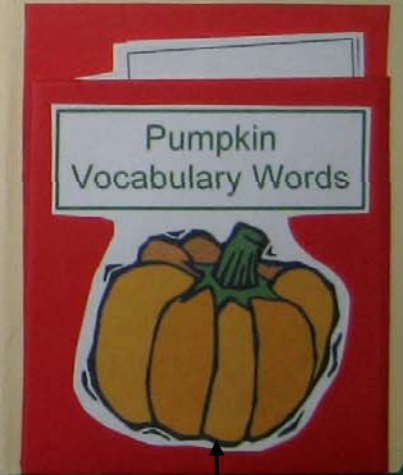

Five Little Pumpkins

Print up on card stock - Trim. Attach to orange piece of card stock, and then attach to the inside of the lapbook. Print up pumpkins and trim. Laminate.

Put a small piece of velcro on the pumpkins and fence so children can remove the pumpkins as they read the poem.

Print up on card stock. Place an envelope on the back of the lapbook to store the words and number pumpkins

Pumpkin Sequencing

Print up the sheet with the 3 pumpkins on white card stock.

Give to the children to color and cut out.

Glue them in sequence order Largest to Smallest.

The sequence sheets, you can print up on yellow or orange card stock. Otherwise you can hand print the information on construction paper.
