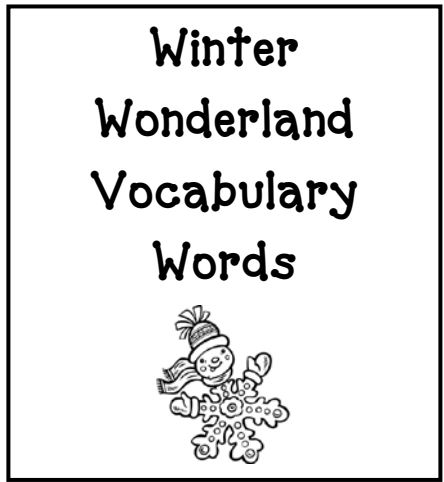
Print up on white card stock

Glue or tape to the Winter Wonderland vocabulary envelope

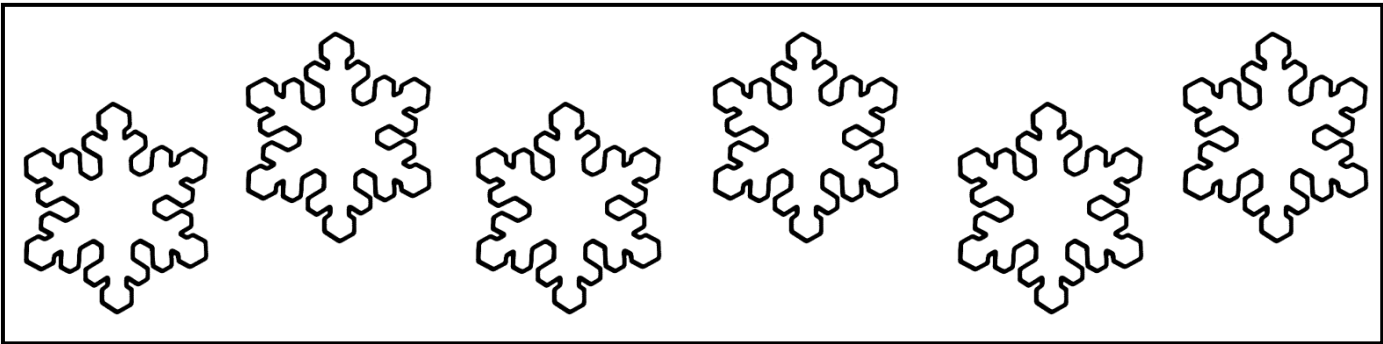




Inside of lapbook

- Glue the graphic of 6 snowflakes below the number worksheet. (View pictures at the beginning of the Winter Wonderland Lapbook file to see placement of items).

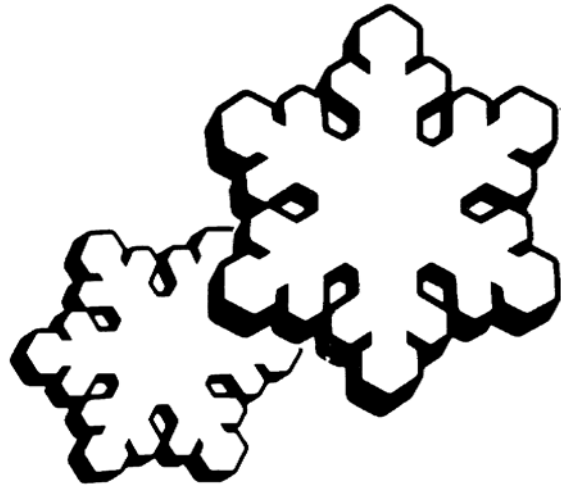

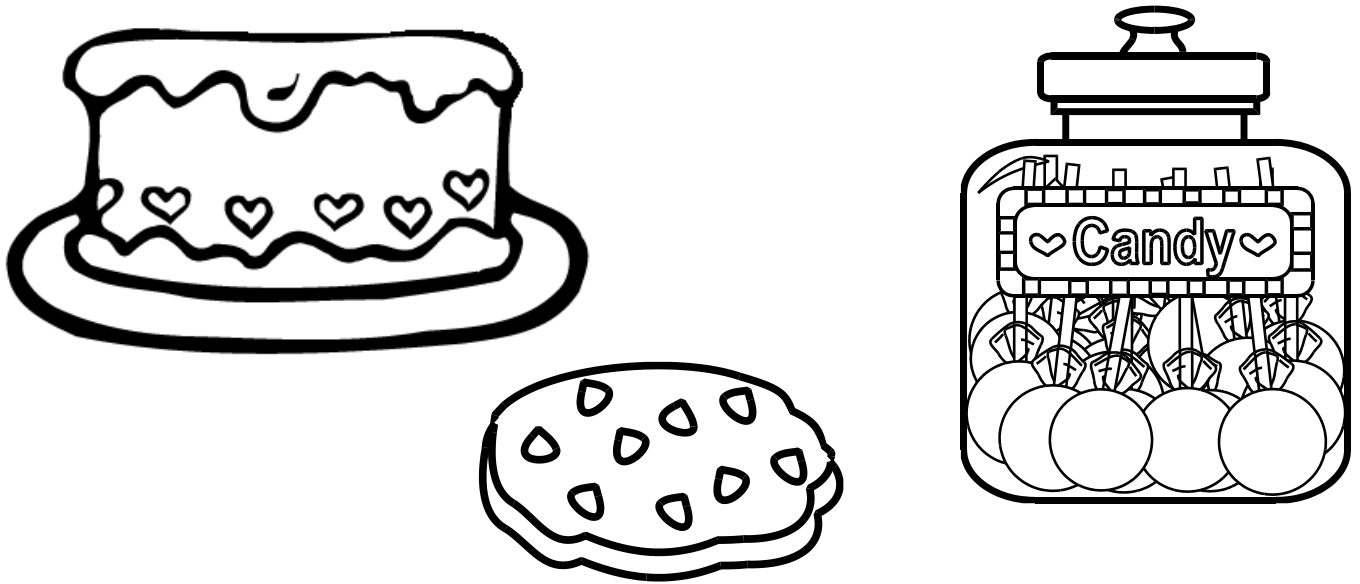
Every snowflake has its own unique shape
and is different than all other snowflakes



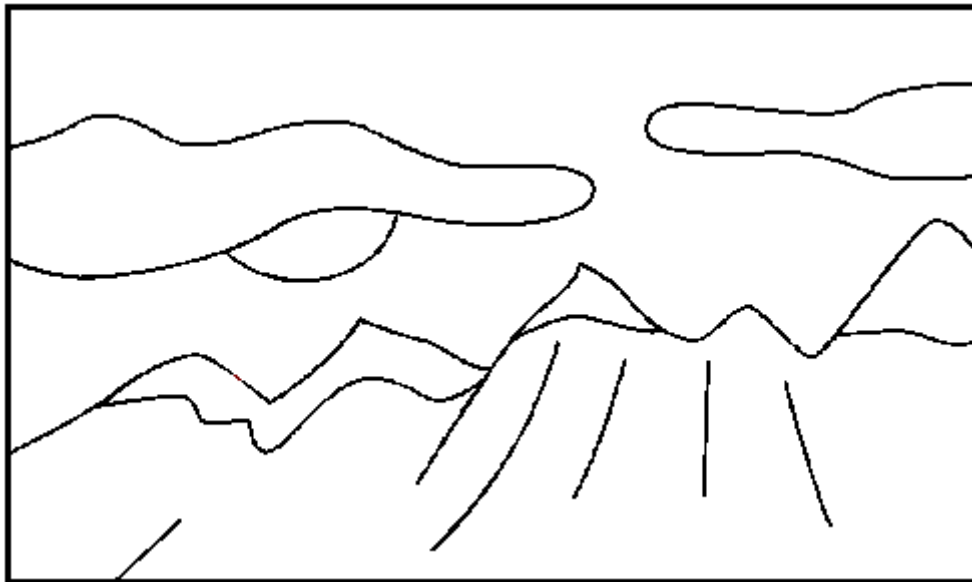
All snowflakes have six sides.

What Can I Do in the Winter? Flip book

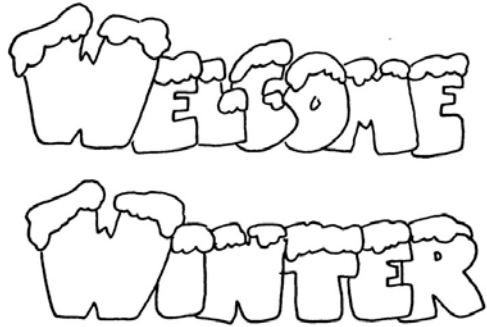
- Print up the following sheet onto regular copy paper.

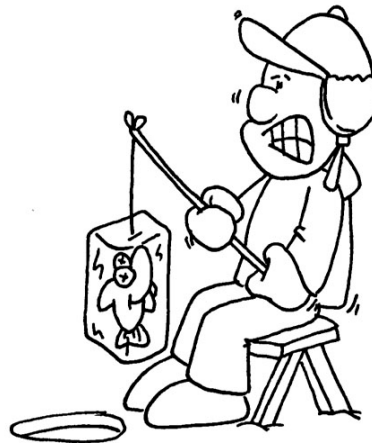

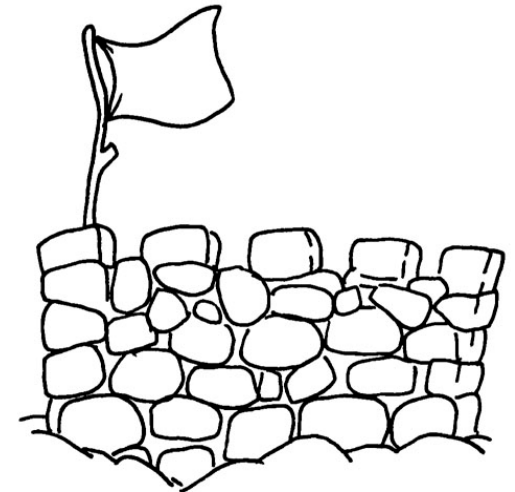

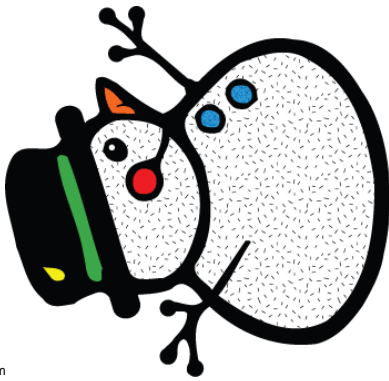


Winter Wonderland Vocabulary Words

- Have children use the cards to practice writing words, or reading.

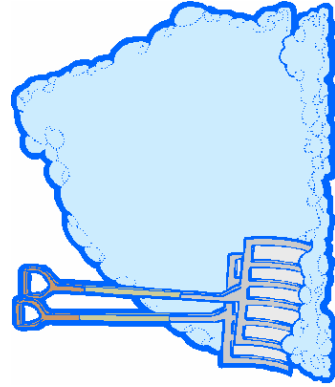
