Zoo Animal or Not a Zoo Animal

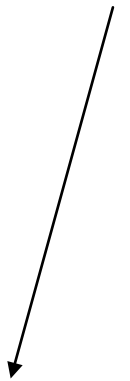
- Print up on white card stock.

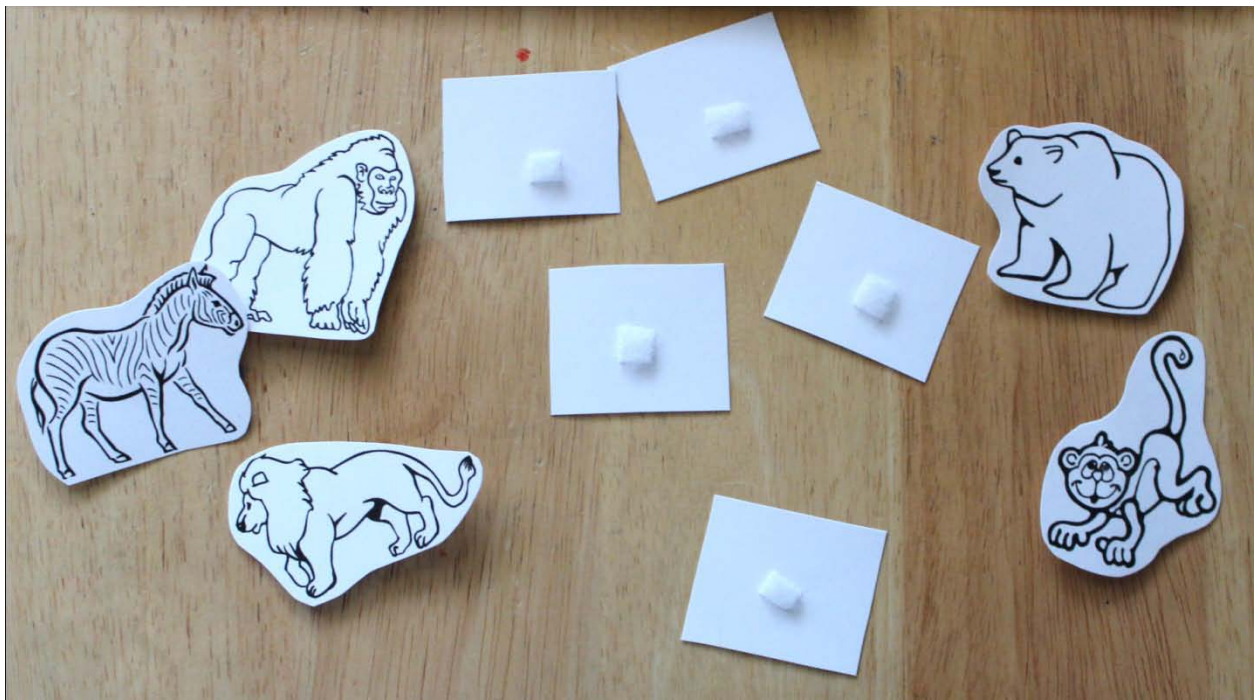


Zoo Animals Numbers

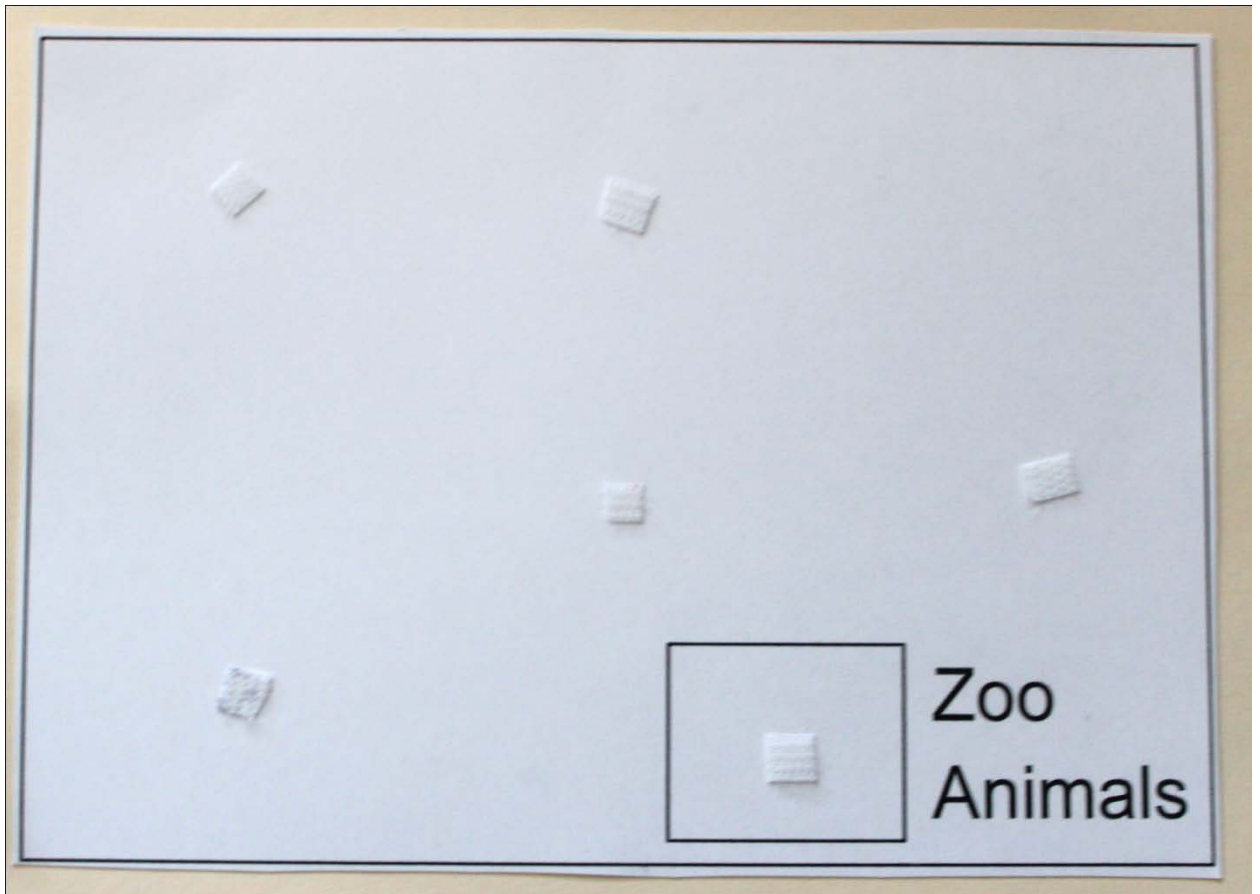
- Print up the following sheet onto white card stock.
- Cut out the items.
- Attach the Zoo Animals mat to the inside of the lapbook. (Look at pictures at the beginning of this file to see placement).
- On the back of the number cards place a small piece of velcro. (Using the soft side of the velcro).
- Attach a small piece of the rough side of the velcro to the soft piece of velcro, and place the number inside the number box. You will want to place just one piece of the rough velcro in the number box since you will only be using one number at a time).
- Do the animals next. Small soft piece of velcro to the back of each zoo animal, and then attach a small piece of rough velcro. Place the zoo animal picture inside the mat.
- Once you have all pictures placed where you want them, you can remove the pictures, and the rough part of the velcro will stay in place.

Object of Zoo Animal Numbers

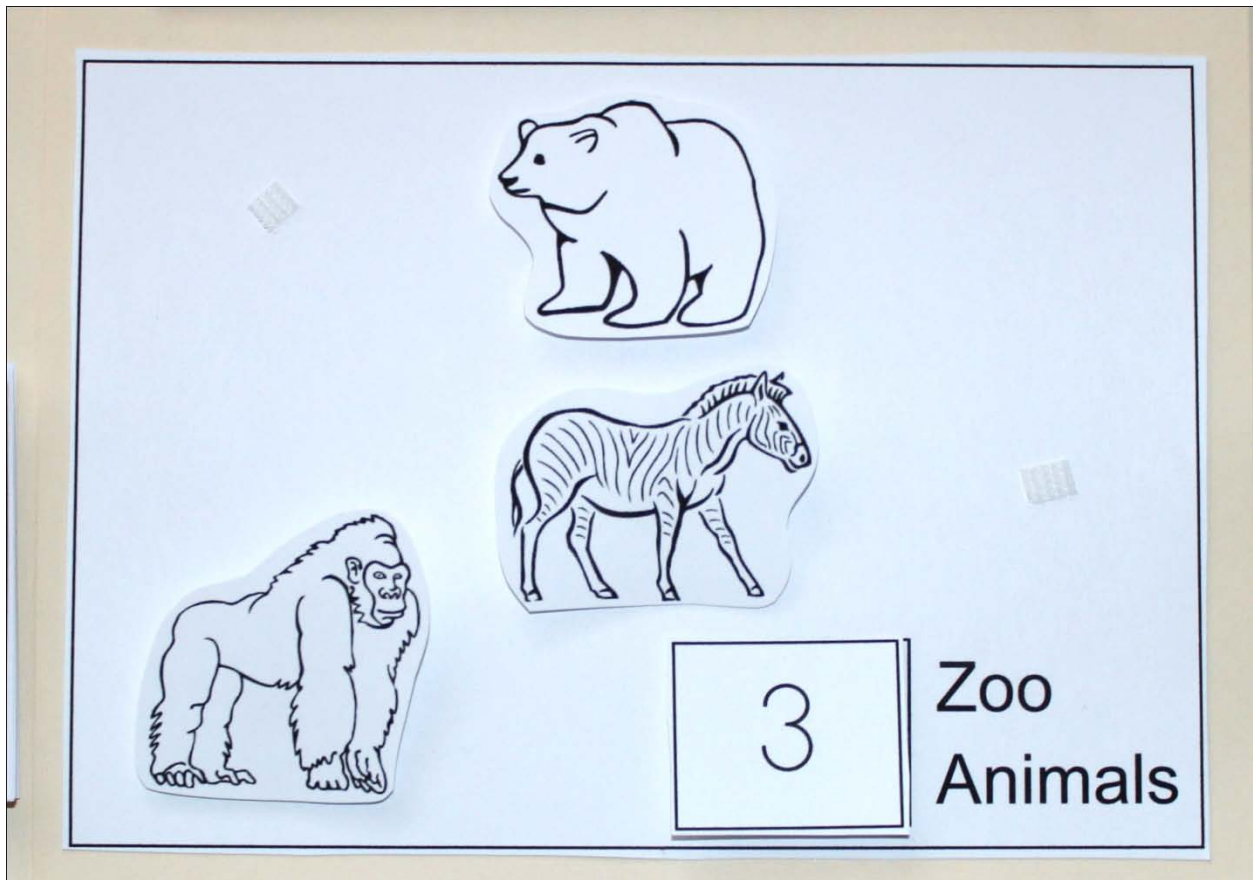
- Have children place a number card inside the number box.
- Have them tell you what the number is.
- Have children then place the correct number of zoo animals inside on the zoo animal mat.
- Children can place this activity again and again by removing the animals and numbers, and placing a new number inside the number box and again the correct number of zoo animals.



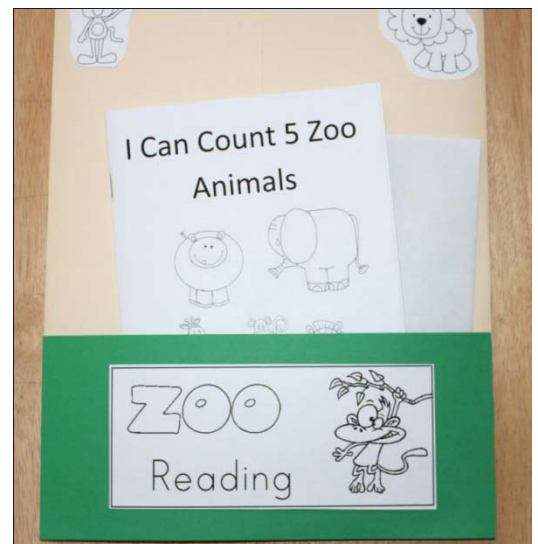
